

HEALTH AND SAFETY POLICIES:

Education Classes

In order to offer our campers and families the safest and most enjoyable experience possible, the following operational changes will be in effect through fall 2020. Policies will continue to be reviewed throughout, but out of an abundance of caution, all procedures will continue until further notice. We have worked directly with Orlando Health in creating these plans and they have made themselves available to continue to offer guidance.

As we reopen, Garden Theatre will incorporate enhanced safety measures, including increased cleaning procedures, the use of appropriate face coverings by staff, campers and guests, limited-contact services, and additional safety training for staff.

An inherent risk of exposure to COVID-19 exists in any public place where people are present. COVID-19 is an extremely contagious disease that can lead to severe illness and death. According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, senior citizens and guests with underlying medical conditions are especially vulnerable.

By participating in events at Garden Theatre, you voluntarily assume all risks related to exposure to COVID-19.

Given this unprecedented situation, we appreciate everyone's patience and understanding as we navigate through this process as responsibly. Each family will receive detailed pick-up and check-out locations and procedures in their lead-up to their week of camp.


Face covering required

All staff, students, and guests must wear a mask that covers their nose and mouth while in the Garden. **Students will be required to bring their own but there will be masks on hand as necessary.**



Temperature check required

Temperature checks will be required upon arrival, and staff, campers, and guests (or anyone in their party) with a temperature of 100.4 degrees or higher will not be admitted.



Physical distancing

We are encouraging physical distancing by utilizing smaller camp sizes, mapping out our classrooms, keeping camps from mixing with one another, staggering start times, and separating check-in/out locations.



Camp/Class Activities

Outside spaces will be utilized for some camp exercises and activities, including lunch breaks. Campers will receive their own bag of supplies for the week to limit the sharing of materials. Group activities will be limited.



Wash and sanitize hands often

We are encouraging staff and campers to wash/sanitize their hands for a least 20 seconds throughout the day. Ample hand sanitizer stations have been strategically placed throughout the classrooms, lobbies, and public areas.



Public Performances

Some individual classes will hold sharings at the end class period. Garden Theatre staff will make a case by case judgement to determine whether an in-person sharing will be safe for everyone. *Matilda JR.* will hold public performances for limited audience sizes. This could change based on guidance from local authorities and public health officials.



Sick Students/Staff

Sick campers/staff are asked to stay home if they are feeling ill. If a staff member or camper appears ill they will be asked to go home immediately.

In addition, if a staff member or camper tests positive or has a known exposure to Covid-19, we will work with the local authorities to notify affected staff and families.
